Description: White cotton cross-stitch on navy blue cotton cloth. Triangular panel at the top of the apron. (CS: Design represents the child Liu Hai fishing for the three-legged toad 'Ch'an', with a string of cash. At the bottom, fishes, the dragon gate, tassels.) At bottom of the apron, square of the blue cloth added and sewed to form two pockets and a flap. Pink cloth rosette^{at the top} and blue cloth loops at each side for the attachment of tying cords.
