People or Culture: Chinese 35 miles NE of T'ung-ch'uan

Object: Boy's cap [San-t'ai]. [Chd lung ch'ang is probably a very small village]

Material: Padded cotton, fortified cloth, silk, metal

Description: Round black padded cotton cap with white lining. On top, pair of white fish, made of painted cloth and stuffed; confronted opposite (CS: lotus-bud) made of purple fortified cotton; piece of wire coming out of bud; from each fish-tail, a silk tassel, one blue and one pink. Fish standing on black and white appliquéd lotus-leaf. On fish and lotus, outlines of flat gold strips. At right end, a blue cotton cord from which a brass coin is hanging; at left, blue cord

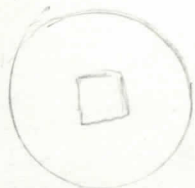
