Name Bow. Of palm wood. One side curved; opposite side flat. Thin twisted string of bark. Used in chase

and warfare. A large part of a man's time is devoted to hunting and fighting, in both of which pursuits he makes constant use of the bow and arrow. The bows are identical in type with those possessed by the neighboring Negritos.
