Name Bow ^(bakāk) Of palm wood. One side roundish, other side flattish. Hand grasp of bow of tanned deer hide. Thin twisted string of bark. Used in the chase and warfare. A large part of a man's time is devoted to hunting and fighting, in both of which pursuits he makes constant use of the bow and arrow.
