This arrow is known under the general name
bagawat or belowat. It is of special value in
securing wild hogs for these animals are exceedingly
hard to kill. The ~~detachable~~ points pull out from
the shafts and drag behind the victim thus
hindering its escape.

When not in use the head is slipped under
the shaft cord.
