Forges are found in a few Bukidnon villages. They consist of two cylinders hollowed out of logs. In these are plungers made of wood with a packing of feathers. As the plungers are alternately raised and lowered the air is forced through bamboo tubes into a bed of charcoal. Knives and crude spearheads are beaten out on stone anvils, by means of stone hammers or occasionally iron ones.
