The cat is leering with astonishment at a couple of butterflies. The Chinese have made the observation that the cat changes the form of her pupil in the course of a day, that it is round in the morning, and evening, and is gradually growing longer and thinner during the day, and assumes a thread-like shape towards noon. A cat with such a pupil serves to illustrate a hot summer-noon, with the addition of a cluster of peonies, wide open and dulled in hue; in the morning, the calyx of the peony wet with dew is contracted and of fresh colors, but it displays its petals at noon. The cat is further leering at a butterfly and besides its naturalistic import, the picture, by means of punning, has an allegoric meaning, "May you obtain wealth, honorable position and old age."
