Enamelled paintings are mirrored on each vase of one yellow and brown duck biting his wing, one orange and grey duck stretching his neck, one green and blue duck quacking as they stand in short grass encircled by tall flowering grasses. Each vase has a different text in black with the same artist's mark in red. On the base, in double square, is the four-character reign
