Name Clay cone with inscription of Lipit Ishtar in duplicate, one copy on perimeter, one on base. Semitic inscription of the fifth king of the Isin dynasty

which ruled central Babylonia B.C. 2357-2132. The inscription refers to this king's building operations, at Isin the capital, on the chapel of Enlil and Ninlil.
