Provenience: Phillipines. Luzon Island. Village of
Kakidugén.

People or Culture: Ilongot.

Object: Knife blade, handle, sheath.

Material: metal, bamboo,

Description: A-blade, handle; handle made of thin cylinder of metal, flattened at end to receive blade, which is a thin, tapering crescent, jammed securely with bamboo.

B-same as above, yet without bamboo and smaller, and with heavier handle.

C-sheath, crudely ornamented and decorated by thin wire, fastening the two halves together.

Note: used harvesting rice, cutting food, by the women.

Note: often made of knife blades that have broken.
