The back cords are soft and pliable.

arrow shafts of straight mountain cane with a variety
of iron points.

Shafts feathered with feathers of hawks & other
large birds. Three feathers are placed about
the arrow & securely wrapped at each end with
a thin strip of rattan or grass.

When an animal is struck ^{with} shaft with ^{attached} barbed head, the
point leaves the shaft unwinding a coil which attracts
it to the reel. Shaft catches in brush, barb will not tear
out of flesh.
