The Ifugao are especially skillful in wood-carving, and many articles in daily use are thus ornamented. Among the most common of these are spoons, the handles of which are carved to imitate men and women. Oftentimes the bowls of the spoon are of copper with handles of wood, while in some cases the whole utensil is of metal.
