uninscribed. Inscription on second, larger base reads: "Utterance by the Moon, great god, lord of the sky, ... (and) all the gods: 'All life and health are given to the revered one, the house-mistress Amenirdis, daughter of Pshrs, born of the house-mistress Tshrs ...'" Leiblin does not mention these last two names!

Cairo 38031, which, ac. to its inscr., is of "Osiris the Moon," is almost a twin, but has only one base, a different inscr., and a less distinct adz. inscrip. hand. Waresy calls its date Saite. Cf. also Cairo 38038.
