also a vulture headdress (one wing and a talon holding Ω [symbol of eternity?]) are visible behind her right ear) and armlets and bracelets. Body from waist down is clothed in plumage of a falcon, whose head appears on back. Sides of throne too are covered with falcon breast-feathers along with symbol of union of Upper and Lower Egypt. On its rear the union is being consummated by the deities personifying the two regions. Over back of throne are hung lotus buds and blossoms.

Whites of eyes inlaid with gold.

Edge of base was inscribed, but only traces remain.
