part of each arm. Ring on back of base of letters.  
Right hand one held a weapon or wand with  
curved blade perhaps growing out of a papyrus  
flower and ending in a hawk's head. See arm  
list as in Cairo 38076 and 38078. That end will have  
rested against right shoulder. Description  
around base is all lost except scanty traces on  
front.
