Description: Pottery vase, tall with high foot rim, marked with three horizontal bands around the body, and partly covered by a shiny black glaze, slip, or lacquer much decomposed. Just above shoulder the zone between 2nd and 3rd band is decorated with vertical rows of wavy lines. Body is hard, gray clay, almost stoneware. Shape is like Han green-glazed vases, but lacks handles and masks. May be Han date (206 B.C.-220 A.D.) or later. See last paragraph of 116463.
