The collector's tag is attached and reads:

"Yai'yera of Cockatoo Feathers ('ai' sounded like 'y!')  
Species of cockatoo called 'Tchakkal Tchakkal', Handle is  
called 'Beendee'. Used in a dance (1907) called the  
'Door'daa'rookēning' (doordaaroo = name of special dance,  
kēning = dance). (Corroborre is a N.S. Wales word.)" Used  
in a dance at which Mrs. Bates was present. This later note  
by Fuller.
