Detailed description: Good-sized wooden kava bowl with good dark brown color to wood; flat rim; kava encrustation on interior; legs (all 10 of them) are incised and the low portions filled in with white pigment. The incised legs are an unusual feature of such bowls. Two-hole suspension See reverse
