**Description:** Canoe for lagoon fishing and equipment consisting of 1 mast, sail, bailer, two long pieces of sennit line, and three pieces of lashing line. Kanava wood hull is made of pieces of planking lashed together with sennit line through holes bored 6 to 6.5 c.m. apart along the seams. Sail is triangular and basket woven of pandanus with a border design of red-dyed pandanus. One mast is present and
