Fuller label - Rotuma or Tonga. This is a rare and fine specimen as the points are broken as usual. It is typically Rotuman - very long, dark colour, straigh line carving. no suspension loop - but the butt-end is most unusual as it is splayed out instead of being perfectly straight (which also applies to Tonga). Samoa is the home of splayed-out clubs in Polynesia. The shallow etched lines up the shaft is pirely Rotu man. but it is often missing: ?Traces are here (see pencil mark). I strongly favour Rotuma.
