Fuller label - Sandwich Is ? A ladle of very unusual type and careful workmanship, the construction of the handle resembling those of Kahilis. The specimen appears to be a genuine "native" object, but with European influence and of late date. This is a scribshaw by a sailor possibly Hawaiian but probably White. From the collection of the late Edw. Armitage R.A. of Greenhills, Tilford, near Farnham, Surrey.
