He ranked among the foremost landscapists of the period, and is spoken of as "the second Wang" among "the four great Wang," who were distinguished painters.

The four-line stanza written by the artist on top of the picture is as follows: "When I look at the clouds, it seems as though the green mountains were moving. When the clouds pass hurriedly, the mountains still remain. I behold Mount Ying, but Mount Ying has forgotten me. Returning home I cleaned my palette and sketched Mount Ying. Written in a boat in the year sin-wei (1631). Wang Kien."
