Description: Two wood caulking mallets. Made of very hard wood (Marshallese kungi). Known locally as "ironwood". Today they are used to drive in the small wedges that tighten the lashings that bind together the hull planks of the canoes, rather than as caulking mallets.

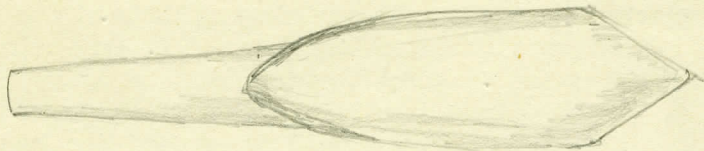
