Object: Pair of sandals (Angamuk)

Material: Leather

Description: Sandals are cut from a piece of cow hide, often the corner of a sleeping mat. Heels are rounded, toes squared and the leather thong binding has a single toe strap. Repaired with nailed leather beneath the heels. Used for every day and in forecasting the future. They are thrown and the resulting pattern has a meaning (see collectors notes).
