Object: Man's headdress (Anukunuku)

Material: Felt, fabric, feathers, wire, sisal fibre

Description: ^{A.} Skull cap of khaki felt overlaid with black fabric. Back half is covered with white pelican feathers from L. Rudolf. A band of orange cloth is sewn across the top front with a rounded band down the front to simulate older mud hair-do. On this and on the crown are rectangles of feather holders consisting of woven circles of fibre string decorated with sewn wire. Recent adaptation. Used by initiated men. Insect damaged.
