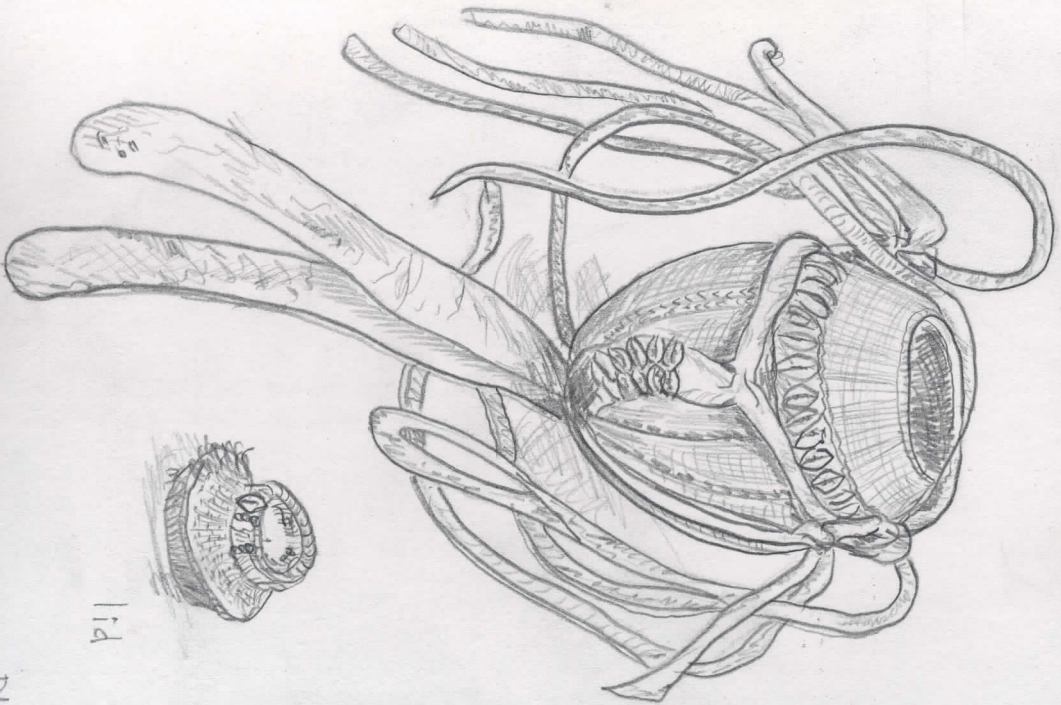

Field No.	People or Culture: Samburu Object: Milk Container, with lid Material: A (Lid): fiber, cowrie shells, glass beads (white, orange) B(Basket):fiber,pitch,hide, cowrie shells and cordage Description: A:Lid: made of stiff basketry fibers, tapers to fit into mouth of basket, with projecting handle. Beads and shells around handle. B: Ovoid basket coated with pitch on inside in carrying harness of flat strips of hide. Decorated with four cordage strips and a circle of cowrie shells. Two strips for the handle, four strips are fastened around the shoulder of the basket, run down to the base, and have two long strips of hide dangling down. Dimensions: B: H.= 18.7; W.=15.0; L.(lower strips)=50.0 (in cm.) A: Max. Dia. = 8.7; H.=4.7 (lid)
