The source of the Parvati identification on the reverse is uncertain. J. R. Francisco agreed with Bosch (probably the best authority—see letter in accession jacket) that the most likely identification is one of the Mahayana Buddhist Taras. But no competent authority can be definite even as to whether it is Buddhist or Hindu.

Bosch favored a local Mindanao origin and a 10th century date. Beyer seems to slightly prefer a Javanese origin. Francisco is noncommittal. The anonymous FMNH expert seems to have favored Java and a Majapahit (14th c) date; why the expert thought this is not clear.
