Provenience: Philippine Islands, Luzon Island, Village of Pengezaben.

People or Culture: Ilongot.

Object: Fiddle and bow.

Material: Wood, rattan, human hair, plant fiber.

Description: A.-Bow of rattan, curved. One end curved back a handle. Both ends frayed for decoration. Strung with black human hair, knotted through ^{slit} at one end, wrapped around other end. B.-Fiddle of light colored wood. Peg box, neck, body carved of single piece. Pentagonal body hollowed out with thin board covering front, pegged at top, bound at bottom with rattan strip. K-shaped hole cut in center of front. Peg box has 3 pegs: 1 paddle-shaped; 2 cylindrical. 3 strings.

to 2 plant fiber strings which are stretched under bottom and threaded through holes at lower end of back. Rattan loop at tip of peg box. Strings pass over (C) high, pentagonal bridge with flaring base and U-shaped cutout at bottom. Letters "P", "T" burned on side of bridge. Acc. collector: "Usually only played by the men, who play their head hunting songs and others on it."
