Left eye's bead is missing; right eye has a red bead. A line of beads, three red and one blue, runs vertically down from the figure's neck. B is a leather apron with bead trimming: groups of two red, blue, or white beads are sewn around edge and groups of two red or blue beads form a vertical row from top to bottom center of cape, which is fastened around figure by brown thread.**Dimensions:**
