Description: A medium sized, round bottomed, wide-mouthed pot with a flared rim. Is used for cooking soup, usually over a fire. The sides and bottom are decorated with rouletting done with a corncob and a twisted cotton tool. There is also a wavy line decorating the shoulder. Somewhat basted with a bark dye which turns the surface darker red-brown.
