Description: A thin wooden handle is split in two directions at one end and two pieces of bowl-shaped aluminum sheet are inserted, curved sides down. Splits are bound with pieces of wire. Whisk is used in making a watery porridge called ugi. Wooden stem is twirled between the palms to stir the porridge. Unused.
