The nomenclature used in the description of Mandaya cloth made along R. Manabgas, etc is given by Garwin of the Bureau of Science as follows.

Dagmay - skirt.

Kang-rem :- When the warp has been dyed black with a concoction of kanaom bark. This is easily dyed but is not very durable. Less valuable than other types.

Liniba :- When warp is dyed red with root of sibatig shrub. Takes 2 wks & is good. Much more durable color.

Binagakis :- A dagmay in which the design panels are narrow and of same pattern. So called from bakis, binakus, a girdle made up of several strands of vegetable fiber (or hair) because these strips give impression of being strand of girdle.

Pinalaoran :- When has one white band around the waist.

Sinaklit :- When has several thin white bands around ^{at equal} waist intervals, so called from saklit.
