Description: Vessel for liquid (water). Lower $2/3$ of vessel ovoid, drawing upward and inward to elongated neck and small mouth (4 cm diam). Medium brown color. Flat bottom. Slightly chipped mouth. Undecorated neck. Horizontal combed band on upper shoulder followed by large, open-topped semicircular band, $1/2$ grooved/ $1/2$ punctated. Mid-zone decorated with 4 consecutive bands of 2 alternating triangle types: 1 composed of horizontal lines within a triangle; (over)
