Object: headpiece

Material: secondary wing feathers of Crotophaga major
and split cane

Description: A very simple headpiece, in which the feathers project in a vertical direction, instead of horizontally, as in most Nambiquara headpieces. Feathers of uniform size are tied to a circle of split cane, which is surfaced with another piece of split cane, the two pieces being bound together with a cotton string which is reddened with dye from the berries of Bixa orellana.
