Each of these rings consists of four concentric rings of split cane, which have been bound together by a spiraling string, with a zig-zag of buriti fiber woven between the crossings of this string, in the interstices between the split cane. The two flat rings thus formed are tied together, with a string of toucano feathers running between them so that the points of the feathers project horizontally. Made by
