**Provenience:** Africa Kenya**People or Culture:** Kamba**Object:** Arrow (kilunda)**Material:** Wood, iron, cow ligament, feathers, paint**Description:** Game-killing arrow is made of mukakaa wood and is tipped with a hand made iron point. Tip is a traditional arrow shape on a narrow stem. It was inserted in the shaft and bound with chewed cow ligament taken from the animal's leg. Fletching is vulture feathers also bound with ligament. Identifying marks in red paint are on the notched end.
