Description: Game hunting arrow is made of Mukakaa wood with a hand made iron tip inserted and bound with chewed cow ligament. Tip is flat, rounded at the base and tapering to a point. It has a spurred stem. Fletching is vulture feathers bound with cow ligament. A red paint mark is used to identify the owner.
