Material: Woody grass, chonta palm, feathers, string, fiber.

Description: Shaft of woody grass with nodes. Fore-shaft, rod of chonta palm carved to blunt point, inserted with black gum in end of shaft which is wrapped with dark brown fiber. Nock cut in end of shaft and string-wrapped. Straight feathering, pink and a blue feather tied near nock with string rubbed

Dimensions: with a light blue substance. Just beyond feathers shaft is wrapped in brown fiber.
