Slightly spiral feathering; a black and a yellow-blue attached with string, some of which is green and wraps Dimensions: 2 small red feathers against the shaft. (in cm.) Beyond feathering shaft wrapped in brown length - 177 fiber. Made by men. Sketch reverse.
