**Object:** Bowl containing dried curare Collier.

**Description:** Black pottery bowl with flat circular bottom; convex sides have protruding edge ca. 1.3 cm. above bottom; flat circular rim. Contains dried curare, most of which is gathered in plastic container. Used for mixing curare. The rim is chipped.

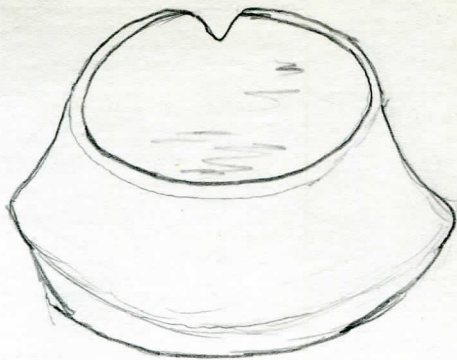
