**Object:** clay pot

**Material:** clay

**Description:** A small, heavy, somewhat irregular pot with a flared rim, made of a bluish clay, and covered with a brownish organic material, apparently after firing, which is beginning to peel off. As this pot indicates the Nambiquara do know how to make ceramics, although the techniques used are a bit crude, and the output seems to have always been low. Pots are no longer made; this specimen was made especially for the collector.

**Dimensions:** diam. at rim: 16.4; diam. of body: 13.1;  
(in cm.) height: 11.4; sides 1.4-1.8 thick, base 2.3.
