Description: Made with tapa (*ari*), tumbuna beads (*mi*), Job's tears (*tomorera*), and nylon string (*ao*). Strip of tapa with bead and seed decoration. Two rows of grey Job's tears with a tumbuna bead in between and on either end; all strung on nylon string.

Worn only by men, above the biceps.
