Shaft of tiktik (<i>depu</i>). Design of long x's between segmentation. White dots periodically on shaft. Hardwood point of (<i>wunan</i>). Point has 3 lines of barbs/"thorns" running down it. Barbs are called (<i>dEk mu</i>). Point is decorated with paint and carving. Paspas of bush rope (<i>albi</i>). String of (<i>tulip</i>), or (<i>ka</i>) around top of shaft and junction of point and shaft.</p>
