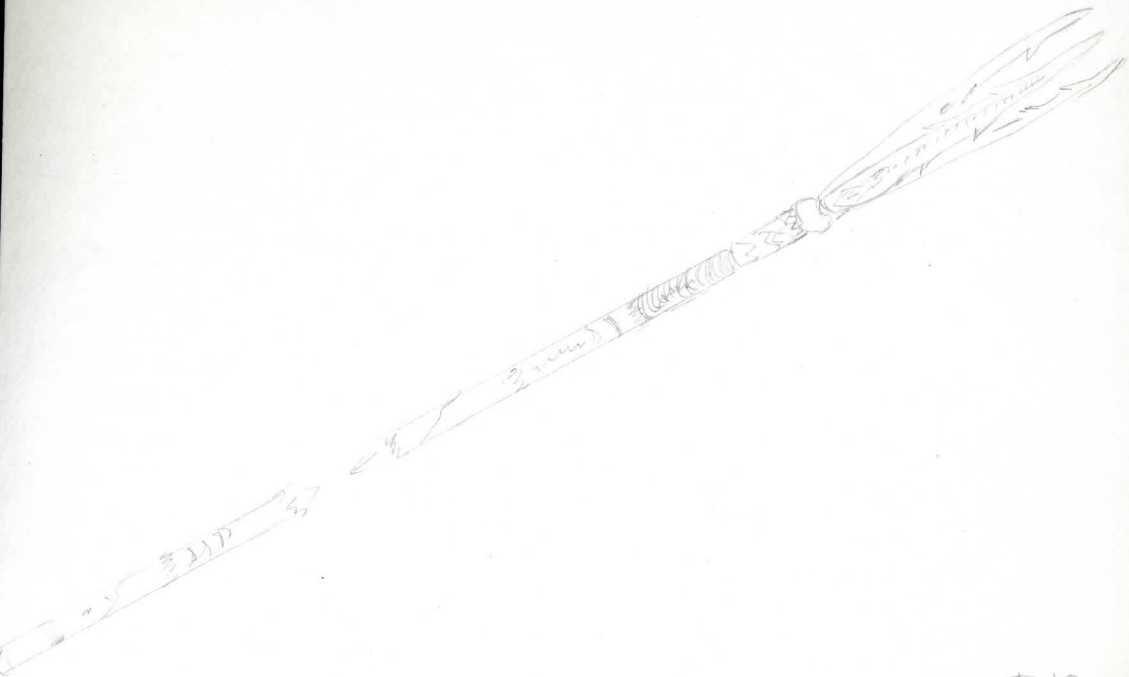
**Description:** Arrow with cane shaft and pronged bamboo [?] point. (*Lei*) refers to arrows with prongs. Shaft is light-colored and has a desing of lines on it. Point has 3 barbed prongs. Prongs have desings incised on them. Ring of black paint around shaft near point and at base of point. Made in Lumi area. Purchased at Lumi Station from Ruben Kinson. Ruben is originally from Nondup, Rabaul. He is married to Helen Acak of Lemieng.
