Material: Tapir bone, wood, woody grass, string, gum
and paint.

Description: Woody grass shaft, longer wooden foreshaft
and a carved tapir bone point forming a tip and single
barb, affixed with string wrapping and black gum.

Where foreshaft fitted into shaft and at butt end of
shaft is a wrapping of white string some blackened
with gum. Foreshaft decorated with black and with
red-brown paint. Sketch reverse side.
