Material: Painted wood, cotton cloth and threads


Description: Paddle shaped club carved from hardwood, painted black, incised with geometric designs. Paddle end has thick center tapering off to blade-like edges with V wedge carved out of tip. The other end tapers to an oval-grip, wrapped with white cotton sewn in place and decorated with three rings of multicolored (blue, green, red, yellow) cotton threads at equal intervals. A loop cotton string is attached to the middle cotton ring.
