

People or Culture: Caraja Field No. Object: Costume-mask (Sketch at back) Material: Palm leaf, feathers Costume for Arauana ceremony, part of the Description: mask cult. It is a three-tiered section consisting of (A) mask-headdress, (B) cape & (C) kilt. The headdress is topped with a tubular shaped section covered with multicolored feathers pasted in such a way as to create a design. Feather pendants suspend Neg. No. from it and the end burst into a myriad of colored Dimensions: freshers after sunding 24 smaller tube-like (in cm.)

Cape - L - 47, dia of neck hole - 2.2

Kilt - (opened) - - L - 68, W - 255 Collection: Presented by Mr. Clayton Templeton, 2801 10 June 1963. Collected by donor, 1961.

Used by men to impersonate supernatural being.
