Name Clay cone found at Ellasar. Inscribed on perimeter with Sumerian inscription recording the erection of a temple to Ninegal goddess of the lower world by the wife of Rim-Sin, king of Ellasar, possibly the Arioeh of Genesis, or his brother. His wife is here called Simat-Ishtar. 22nd Century B.C.
