VOTIVE STONE

Carved on four sides. In front, seated in a niche, is Yü Huang, Taoist god of heaven, bearded, with headdress of old Chinese style and swastika on his chest, surrounded by two bearded, standing attendants. The background is adorned with lotus petals. Above the niche, there is a roof with the figure of a crane and other emblems. On each of the narrow sides a triad is crudely incised, likewise on the reverse, where two figures are carved in the aureole of the central deity. Below, a long list of the names of the donors. The lower part of the stone is much damaged and restored.
