MAN'S WINTER CLOTHING

The national costume of Tibet is a large and long sleeved gown, called a *ch'uba*, a name of Turkish derivation. Only the nomadic tribes rigidly adhere to this ancient dress. In summer a *ch'uba* of cloth is worn; in winter one of sheepskin is used. Note the charm box attached to the belt. From the belt hang a powder horn, a leather pouch containing bullets, and copper cartridges ready to charge. The sword scabbard is made of wood.
